Simple Pancake Recipe – Easy to follow

- 1. Sieve flour.
- 2. Add beaten egg and sugar.
- 3. Mix to a batter adding buttermilk.
- 4. Pour small quantities onto a hot greased pan.
- 5. Turn when bubbles burst on top side.

Tip: Use Neill's Soda Bread Flour
We just put all the ingredients in the bowl and mix.

14th February




- 1. Cream, butter and sugar.

Child safety tips





Medicines should be stored out of children's reach especially those without child resistant packaging

Curriculum News:

Outer Space

We are learning about outer space.
We will talk about rockets,
astronauts, planets, the moon, stars,
space and aliens.

You could help at home by taking me outside at night to look at the moon and stars.

You could also help to develop my counting skills by counting from 1—10 forwards and then backwards "5,4,3,2,1 blast off!"

Start to talk about numbers on signs or car number plates or your front door.

Hospital Play

We will read a story called "Topsy and Tim go to the Doctor".









We will set up a hospital corner in the classroom and pretend to be doctors, nurses, patients and receptionists. We will continue to use the words stethoscope, thermometer, medicine, bandage and x-rays.

Concepts: Long and Short

We have been learning about Winter clothes to keep us warm and cosy.

We will look at lots of scarves and socks to see if they are long or short.





Story: "Aliens Love Underpants"

We will read and discuss this popular story and have lovely displays relating to the story in the nursery.



We will also use this fun story to develop the children's counting skills from 1 - 10 as we count the aliens in the story.

Respecting Difference

We will meet another puppet called Kim. Kim's story aims to foster acceptance, respect and inclusion of children from ethnic minority communities.
